AAACA 80th National Annual Meeting –Recap



Current / Pending Legislation News -Your MAAC representatives will be on Beacon Hill to present on the following Bills:

SB1830 - Year of manufacture registration plates

MAAC Supports this bill, which would make a "restored" plate acceptable for registration of a Antique Vehicle

SB1834 - Street rods and custom vehicles

MAAC Supports this change to the current requirements for registering a Street Rod and Custom Vehicle.

SB1805 - Single Plate Bill

MAAC Supports this change to the current requirements from two plates to one plate for registration.

HB3099 - Clean Plate Bill

MAAC Does NOT Support this change to institute a "rolling 10 year replacement" of all issued plates.
